

We look for candidates who:

- Hold a nationality of an OECD <u>Member country</u>;
- Have obtained or will obtain a Bachelor's degree between January 2024 and September 2025 (to be eligible, candidates may <u>NOT</u> hold or be enrolled in a Master's or PhD);
- Demonstrate a record of strong academic achievement with a minimum Grade Point Average (GPA) of 3.0 out of a 4.0 scale*;
- Have fluency in one of the two OECD official languages (English and French) and a commitment to reach a good working level of the other;
- Demonstrate the ability to contribute as a YA in the area of work, as well as demonstrate motivation to pursue a graduate degree in a relevant field after completing the Programme.
- Can start the Programme in September 2025 for the two-year assignment.
