

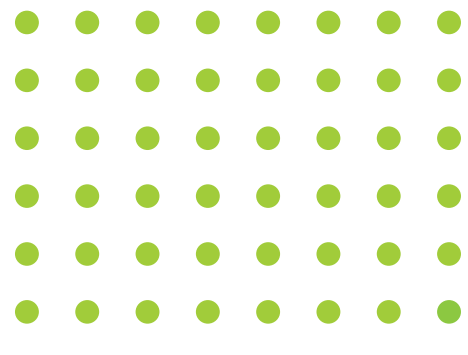

The Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) is an **international organisation founded in 1961**, that works to ***build better policies for better lives***.

WHAT WE OFFER



Headquarters is in Paris, with additional **regional centres** located in Berlin, Crete, Istanbul, Mexico City, Tokyo, Trento, and Washington DC.



Internships can last between **one and six months** (renewable up to a total of **twelve** months).



Interns benefit from:

- a monthly **contribution to living expenses** (1000 euros in Paris).
- **2.5 days of leave per month** when the duration of the internship is longer than 2 months, and **public holidays** observed by the OECD duty station.
- **Flexible working arrangements** (with the possibility to telework from outside the duty station, in accordance with OECD guidelines).
- Various **training opportunities** (online and teacher-led), including languages courses.
- An **active intern community** organising events to help them connect and network.
- An **international environment**, working with experts from 38+ countries.

WHO CAN APPLY

Internships are open for students who:

- Are **enrolled in a full-time accredited degree programme** (Bachelor's, Master's or PhD degree) for the duration of the internship in a field or discipline related to the work of the OECD
- Are available for a **minimum internship duration of one month**
- Have an excellent command of one of the **two official languages of the OECD** (English and French) and a working knowledge of, or willingness to learn, the other. Knowledge of other languages could be an advantage
- Have good **quantitative and IT skills**
- Have good **drafting and communication skills**
- Thrive in a **multicultural and international team environment**.



Internships are **primarily allocated to OECD member country nationals**, while also open to **non-OECD Member country nationals for specific programmes and projects**, including across OECD-affiliated bodies and agencies (e.g. International Energy Agency, Nuclear Energy Agency, Financial Action Task Force or International Transport Forum).

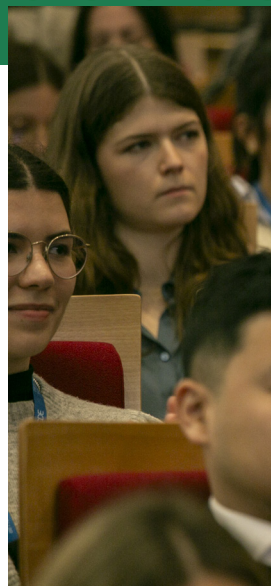
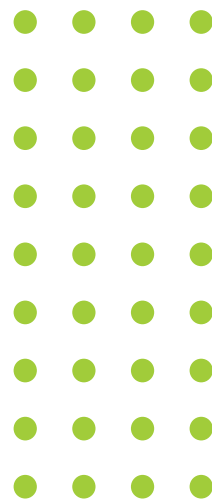

Recruitment process **typically takes 1 to 3 months.**

GOOD TO HAVE

- Strong **analytical skills**.
- Genuine interest in the **work of OECD in promoting international co-operation**.
- Ability to **conduct research independently**.
- Good **organisational** skills, with the capacity to **prioritise tasks**, often according to tight deadlines.
- Proven ability to work in a **multicultural and teamoriented environment** and to adapt to **changing working methods and technologies**.



TOP TIPS

1

Interns are **recruited on a rolling basis**, allowing applications to be submitted at any time. Make sure to indicate your **earliest availability date**, and **apply 3 months before** the desired start date.

2

In your online application, **select up to 3 areas of interest**, and **tailor your cover letter** to highlight your **skills and experiences relevant to these fields** specifically.

3

Familiarize yourself with the team's work by exploring recent [OECD publications](#) to demonstrate your knowledge of and genuine interest in their projects.

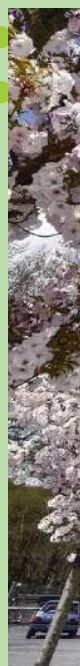
